Advent Lutheran Church Annual Congregational Meeting February 19,2023

Opening Prayer: Offered by Pastor Andy

Confirm Quorum: Over 80 members in attendance, exceeding quorum mandate of 5%. Quorum confirmed by acting Secretary, Ray Welch

Call to Order: Steve Putnik, president, called the meeting to order at 11:38am. **Agenda Approval:** Motion to approve Agenda as submitted was made by Dennis North and seconded by Claudia Loch. Motion was approved unanimously.

Approval of February 27, 2022 Annual Congregational Meeting Minutes:

Motion to approve Minutes as written was made by Debbie Giggey and seconded by Kevin Wrenne. Motion was approved unanimously.

President's Report: Steve Putnik presented his report and submitted it as a matter of written record. He highlighted the work done to revise our ByLaws and spoke about the work done on the upcoming building project.

Presentation of Ministry Reports: All reports submitted as a matter of record as written. Pastor Andy introduced and thanked all the pastors and administrative staff. Pastor Dave introduced and thanked all church ministry staff.

Presentation of Statistical/Census Report: Pastor Dave submitted the report as written.

Finance Committee Reports: Reports were presented by Dennis North, Finance Committee Chair.

Presentation/Approval of Advent Life Ministries 2023 Budgets: Each budget was presented for individual approval.

Advent Church Boca General Operating Fund Budget: Motion to approve budget was made by Ray Welch and seconded by Dave Diehl. Motion was approved.

Advent Church Capital Budget: Motion to approve budget was made by Ralph Schneider and seconded by Leanne Welch. Motion was approved.

Advent Proclaim Church Budget: Motion to approve budget was made by Dave Franklin and seconded by Nancy Varian. Motion was approved.

Advent Square Budget: Motion to approve budget was made by Claudia Loch and seconded by Adriana Santovenia. Motion was approved.

Advent Schools: The combined financials for Advent Schools, as of 12/31/2022, were submitted for informational purposes. The school budget runs on an academic year and not a calendar year.

Presentation of Nominating Committee: Nominations were submitted by Laura Bluhm, Vice President of Church Council and Chair of the Nominating Committee.

Michael James was nominated to another 3 year term; Dan Munson and Dana Schnieder were nominated for new 3 year positions. A motion to accept the three members to church council was offered by Leanne Welch and seconded by Dennis North. Motion passed.

Presentation of Nominating Committee: (continued) Laura Bluhm nominated Ray Welch to serve as Church Council President for 2023 and the Congregation was invited to nominate a Church Council President from the floor. None were given. Motion to appoint Ray Welch was offered by Kevin Wrenne and seconded by Dave Diehl. Motion was approved. Ray Welch prayerfully affirmed his nomination.

Old Business: None

New Business:

Advent School Budget Deferral. Motion to grant authority to Church Council to approve the 2023-2024 School Budget at a point later in the year, closer to the end of the academic calendar was made by Susie Dzuro and seconded by Linda Brier. Motion passed.

By Laws Revisions. Motion to accept proposed, revised By Laws as a replacement to our outdated, existing By Laws was made by Brian Ballas and seconded by Jim Viane. Motion passed.

Motion from the floor: A motion to keep the current By Laws intact (*Approved draft at 2011 Annual Congregational Meeting. Ratified at 2012 Annual Congregational Meeting 02/05/2012*), as part of our governing documents and for historical purposes was made by Ray Welch and seconded by Bob Lindmark. Motion passed.

Phase II of Construction Project and Contract for Architectural Draw-

ings: A motion was offered to agree to pay up to \$120,000 for architectural renderings, contractual work, and costs associated with a new building/ renovation plans from the building fund. Motion was made by Amy Dingle and seconded by Teresa Diehl. Motion passed.

A motion was offered to agree to pay up to \$30,000 in order to relocate maintenance staff and equipment if new building/renovation plans proceed. Motion was made by Jim Viane and seconded by Kerry Bibighaus. Motion passed.

Audit Deferral: Motion to defer the auditing of year-end financials due to accounting department employee turnover was made by Kevin Wrenne and seconded by Nancy Varian. Motion passed.

Adjourn: Motion to adjourn was made by _____ and seconded by Donna Centebar. Motion passed.

Closing Prayer: Pastor Dave led closing prayer.

Advent Life Ministries Letter from the President 2024

Slightly over a year ago, I was asked by then outgoing president Steve Putnik about a potential term as Advent Advisory Board President. After initially saying "no" several times, I agreed, but stated it would be for one term only.

Here we are, one year later, and my time as president has come to an end.

It has been an unbelievable experience. And even for someone who has been in a leadership position for decades, I still learned from our incredible staff and dedicated volunteers across both our Boca and Lake Worth campuses.

An organization that has grown to our size and scope contains lots of moving parts. Sometimes, those parts are not always moving in the same direction, and when those moments happen - leadership, communication, and decision-making skills become critical. Over the past year, we have fixed some misaligned parts but we must never stop trying to improve these critical skills. As our ministry continues to work towards a future local building project and as we continue to share HIS word and love in places around the world, we run the risk of having many "parts" at odds with one another. Advent needs to remember that our mission, across all our ministries, is to create faithful, loving, compassionate and dedicated disciples of Christ. It's what we do in our schools. It's what we do at Advent Square. And, it's what we do in our churches here in Boca and Lake Worth.

Over the course of the next year, our congregation will face several issues. We will be asked to consider funding a new building project. We will be asked to support the call process for additional pastors and to consider what the leadership succession plan looks like for Advent. The Advisory Board has started some of these discussions, and, we have put in some tangible work on them. But, there is still more work to be done and I'm confident the incoming leadership will continue those efforts.

Finally, I want to say thank you.

To our Pastors...thank you for showing me how to lead from love. To our office staff... thank you for being patient with me and always smiling, even when no one was watching. To the Accounting and HR team...thank you for your efforts in keeping the "business" side of our ministry running as smoothly as it does. To the school principals and department heads... thank you for for letting me into your worlds and helping me understand what you do on a daily basis. A lot of our staff go largely unrecognized until they announce their retirement, but I now know how much of your time, energy and heart goes into your everyday work...thank you for what you do for Advent.

To my fellow board members...thank you for giving up your time every month, it has been a pleasure to govern with you. And specifically, to Kevin Wrenne, Laura Bluhm, and Steve Putnik...I can't thank you three enough. 

- Enrollment We have a total of 267 students this school year (23/24). We opened a second 3rd grade classroom this year along with the two full Kindergarten, 1st and 2nd grade classrooms. We will be opening a second 4th grade class next year and we are anticipating full classes next year based on our current enrollment for the 24/25 school year.
- Community Outreach Our students and families have generously supported our quarterly social concerns projects. For the 1st quarter social concerns service project we collected over 440 food items to provide Thanksgiving meals for local families in need. For the 2nd guarter project we collected over 200 toys for the Family Promise organization.
- Facilities We have completed the installation of a new key card gate access system. A new intercom, bell, and emergency alert system has also been installed and implemented. Both are wonderful upgrades to our security. We are finalizing the installation of Epson projectors in the classrooms which convert a standard whiteboard into an interactive Smartboard.
- Accreditation Our school is due for re-accreditation at the end of this school year. This process requires an in-depth evidence based self-study process that culminates in a three day site visit from an

accreditation team on April 22 – 24. Our staff has been very busy all year completing the requirements for this process. We are accredited by the National Lutheran School Accreditation (NLSA) which serves as the accrediting body for Lutheran schools in the United States and throughout the world.


• Staff Update – I will be retiring at the end of this school year after 23 years at Advent. We hired Shahna Clark as the assistant principal at the start of this school year and she will be assuming the role of principal after mentoring with me for the entire school year. Although, I am sad to leave, I am confident that Shahna's strong Christian faith and her leadership abilities will make her a successful principal of our school.

Despite the challenges of 2023, the ministries of Advent continued to build on their strong financial position, especially as it relates to our cash reserves and reducing our long-term liabilities. It would be hard to summarize all the events of the year in this report, but included with this annual report are the presentation of the results of the different divisions and a combined balance sheet.

Here are a few highlights from 2023 worth noting: General offerings from church members surpassed our budget and exceeded \$1 million for the fourth year in a row!

Based on the results from our operational revenue and enhanced by receipt of an Employee Retention Credit, we accumulated cash reserves over \$2 million in short-term interest bearing investments at year end.

Promissory notes from individuals were reduced by \$140,000 through redemption or forgiveness by members holding them. Campus improvements of almost \$500,000 included the replacement of numerous large A/C units, as well as new access and intercom systems for the school.

The Schools continue to benefit from tuition support programs offered through the state and through other grants and these financial assistance programs have helped us maintain strong enrollment numbers that help bolster the ability to provide a good education in a safe and secure environment.

The Proclaim Church continues to grow and show improvement in giving trends and membership. It provides significant outreach to the local community utilizing the support of numerous volunteer teams each week. At Advent Square, some inspection issues delayed our conversion of some independent living units to assisted living units. The inspection setbacks have negatively affected the financial results of that ministry. It should be noted that during 2023, the accounting department were not operating with a full team, but we are grateful that this team and our Administrative Pastor, Aaron Kruse were able to step up to the challenges that included accounting for the records of all the divisions and preparing numerous reports for the monthly Finance Committee meetings. Special thanks to the Finance Committee members, pastors and several Church Board members for their attendance at numerous and usually long meetings and for their wisdom and dedication in watching over the treasures He has provided us. We pray that we will continue to be blessed in 2024, especially as we continue to address improvements and potential renovations to the campuses.
